- Tyson:** We're giving away 44 pounds of food to each vehicle coming up. We can help a family have a meal for at least five days.
- Andrea:** Thank you – have a good night!
- Ginger:** Andrea, impressed by the quality and quantity of food.
- Andrea:** This is a big blessing for us. This is actual produce that you can actually use and make good meals.
- Ginger:** And so thankful for the meals shared with her daughter.
